This funding will be used to

- Ensure 100% of Year 12 students leave school with a suitable pathway – QCE, QCIA, OP and/or VET qualification.
- Close the gap between Indigenous and non-Indigenous students in attendance and the percentage of students attaining senior certification.
- Ensure all eligible students reach the national minimum standard in literacy and numeracy.

Our initiatives include

- Provide professional development for teachers and school leaders to increase capability to initiate and implement innovative practices in the classroom.
- Identification and extension of high performing students across all learning areas.
- Develop a whole school approach to teaching literacy and numeracy to support teaching across all learning areas.
- Refine the school pedagogical framework (ASOT) and embed it as the shared language of teaching and learning.
- Strengthen the case management and tracking approach to senior students who are on a QCE or QCIA pathway.
- Build leadership capabilities within the school through professional development.
- Develop staff capability to teach digital technologies.
- Build teacher capability to differentiate and improve learning outcomes for all students.

Delivering whole school ICT programs	\$20,000
Supporting Indigenous students attainment	\$10,000
Resourcing whole school well-being programs	\$40,000
Upgrading student and staff resources	\$50,000
Establishing an alternative program for at risk students	\$40,000
